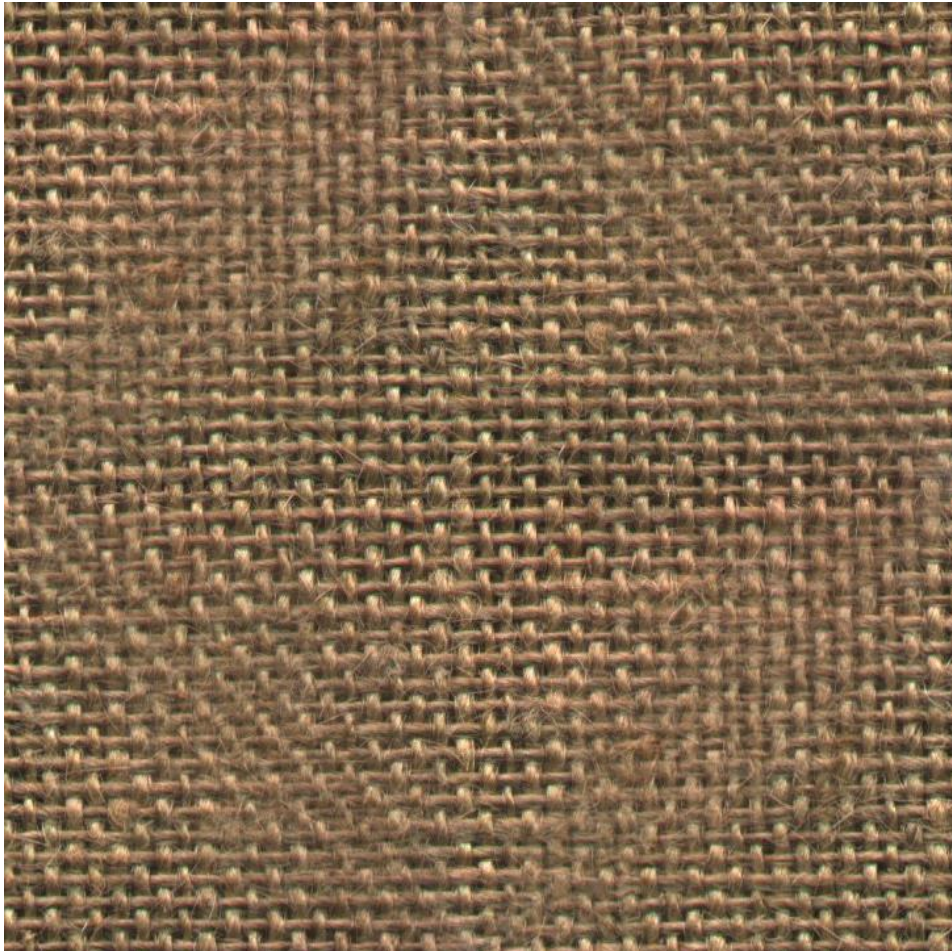


## Hessian cloth



### **Hessian cloth / fabric**

Hessian, or burlap in the US and Canada, is a woven fabric usually made from skin of the jute plant or sisal fibres, or may be combined with other vegetable fibres to make rope, nets, and similar products. Hessian, a dense woven fabric, has been historically produced as a coarse fabric, but more recently it is being used in a refined state known simply as jute

as an eco-friendly material for bags, rugs, and other products. The name "burlap" appears to be of unknown origin, although the word could mean "coarse piece of cloth". The name "hessian" is attributed to the use of the fabric, initially, as part of the uniform of soldiers from the German state of Hesse who were called "Hessians".

Uses :-

Hessian use Decorative Items Several decorative items, toys, wall hanging, paper, decorative bags, table lamps, furniture, and many more is made from hessian fabrics. Hessian tapes and Gaps Hessian tapes and Gaps are made with Hessian cloth. Hessian cloth is woven with gaps at regular intervals and the cloths cut between the gaps to make small width taps

1. This is mainly use for making bags, agriculture and industrial.
2. Carpet backing.
3. Decoration work.
4. It is also durable enough to withstand rough handling in transit; these properties have also led to its use for temporary protection as wet covering to prevent rapid moisture loss in the setting of cement and concrete in the construction industry.
5. Hessian has been used by artists as an alternative to cotton or linen as a stretched painting or working surface.
